A House of Honor

Sermon by Pastor Zach Prosser

- Read 2 Timothy 2:14-21
- The word “honor” is defined as “high respect,” “great esteem,” or “adherence to doing what is right.” In the Bible, we are commanded in multiple instances to honor God, to honor others, and to be people of honor. For example, Romans 12:10 tells us, “Be devoted to one another in brotherly love; outdo one another in showing honor.”

Can you think of an example when someone showed biblical honor to you? What was the outcome?

- It should be remembered that showing honor and love is commanded of us regardless of whether the other person “deserves” it or has “earned” it. Christ took away the punishment for their sins, so we should honor them just as we would honor Him (or expect them to honor us). To do so, we must adopt a kingdom perspective in place of the worldly perspective to which we’re accustomed.

Do you struggle with honoring others—maybe those who have different beliefs, lifestyles, or backgrounds from yours? How might adopting a kingdom perspective help you better to do so?

- The passage from 2 Timothy focuses most of its attention on the words we use when interacting with others: we are not to strive or argue over words, nor should we use irreverent or empty speech; instead, we should focus on the word of truth and speak with gentleness, meekness, and forgiveness.

Can you think of an example when you used harsh, irreverent, or unforgiving speech? What could you have said instead to honor that person?
