

Care Group Discussion Guide

Celebration Church

2 Kings 4:1-7

1. Start with what you have

- The widow was in a desperate financial situation, and Elisha said to her, “What do you have in the house?” She said she only had “a jar of oil” (2 Kings 4:2).
- Stop looking at your problem and start taking inventory of what God has placed within you (gifts, abilities, knowledge, etc.).

2. Engage your faith

- The widow had to believe what Elisha said and confess it to her neighbors when she asked them for their vessels (2 Kings 4:3).
- She was speaking to the mountain (her debt) to move.
- Start speaking words of faith over your problems.

3. Cast out those who will hinder you from receiving a miracle

- The widow had to shut the door behind her (2 Kings 4:5).
- Shut the door on doubt and unbelief.
- Some people need to get rid of the parasites in their lives. They are killing your dreams from the inside.

4. Give what you have

- The widow had to pour out what little oil she had in order for the blessings to flow (2 Kings 4:5).
- Miracles happen when you begin to pour out what God has given you.
- Pour out what you have on someone who needs a blessing.

5. Keep getting vessels

- The widow’s oil stopped pouring when there were no more vessels (2 Kings 4:6).
- The minute you stop getting vessels, the oil will stop.
- God will fill every hungry heart as long as there is a vessel.

6. Leave a legacy for those who follow you

- The widow’s sons could either learn the breakthrough blessing of God or stay in a place of lack and brokenness.
- Abundance possesses legacy, lack possesses what you have and tries to take it.

- God doesn't want you to teach those who come after you to keep circling the mountain. Instead, teach them to speak to their mountains and to believe that they will be removed.
