Key Text: I Kings 19:1-21

- Don't Believe Lies
 - Elijah exposed the lies of the prophets of Baal (I Kings 18:20-40).
 - Satan is the father of all lies (John 8:44).
 - Jezebel's anger at the exposed lies, and her desire to kill Elijah, reveal that she had the spirit of the Antichrist (I Kings 19:1-2).
 - Elijah believed the lie of Jezebel when she said she was going to kill him (I Kings 19:3).
 - He put greater value on his enemy's message than on what God had said.
 - Elijah's response to the message was based on emotions rather than the truth.
 - When you respond to something emotionally, 75% of your brain shuts off and you made poor decisions.

> Don't Forget the Works of the Lord

- Elijah forgot that God promised to send rain to the earth (I Kings 18:1), and He fulfilled that promise (I Kings 18:45).
 - Forgetting God's works will cause you to fear and make poor decisions.
- The Lord gives us many benefits or rewards (Psalm 103:2).
 - Stir up your mind to remember the works of the Lord (2 Peter 3:1).
 - We have the mind of Christ (I Corinthians 2:16).
 - Shut off the distractions and do not listen to the scoffers.
- Meditate on the works of the Lord and talk about them (Psalm 77:11-12).
 - The word "meditate" is the Hebrew word hagah, which means, "to reflect or ponder."
 - To meditate is to feast on the word of God like a lion feasts on his prey. Once the lion has feasted, he normally roars with delight.
 - After meditating on the word of God, His goodness should flow out of our mouths.
